- On March I4, Chester Council approved the Development Agreement for the South Canoe Wind Farm. Council's decision has been appealed to the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (NSUARB) and this process is currently on-going. A hearing will be held on May 30th at IOam at the New Ross Fire Hall.
- The NSUARB approved Nova Scotia Power's participation and capital portion of the South Canoe Wind Farm on April 26. The UARB hearing that took place in February was part of a detailed and transparent public review process, which determined that the project was in the best interest of Nova Scotia Power customers.
- On April 29th, 5l community members attended a project open house and spoke one-on-one with our team members about construction, jobs, CLC, and ideas on community project sponsorship. The project remains on track to meet the December 2014 operation and will start construction this fall.

On May 6, we met with local businesses to share information on the project and learned about local services that could be offered to the project. Thank you to everyone who made it out and shared their ideas!

The Utility and Review Board (UARB) held a hearing from May 30-June 5 on the Appeal of Municipality of Chester Council's approval of a Development Agreement for the wind farm. Thank you to everyone who attended our third meeting with local businesses on July 29th in New Ross. We are finalizing the local business directory which will be submitted to project contractors. Call or email Mary-Frances with any information to be added to the directory. We heard some great questions last night and have updated the FAQs on our website. Also, stay tuned for details on follow up meetings in the coming months!

We are currently awaiting the outcome of three appeals – two before the UARB regarding Chester Municipal Council's Development Agreement approval and one in the Court of Appeals regarding Nova Scotia Power's 49% capital contribution to the project. These appeal processes could continue into early 2014. Being respectful of the UARB and legal process, we are currently revising the project schedule. In light of this, we will begin clearing and road construction following resolution of the appeals.

We remain confident and committed to building the wind farm given that we have full environmental approval, Chester Municipal Council has voted in support of the project, and strong public support. We want to thank you for your support throughout the process and we look forward to working with you to make the project a reality.

We will be sending a local resident to participate in the Wind Turbine Technician Training at Holland College in PEI this September. We have received a lot of interest in this opportunity and will be selecting a candidate in August. Stay tuned for more information in our next newsletter.



We are also committed to supporting community initiatives and will continue to work with the CLC to determine the community project sponsorship selection process and plan to launch this process once all project approvals have been received.

Over the past few months, project activities have been focused on engineering design. We have been working on designing roads, collector system (electrical system that will bring power from turbine to onsite substation) and turbine foundations. We are also currently working with the System Operator to complete the Facilities Studies for South Canoe. These studies confirm the scope and pricing to tie our project into the existing electrical grid. We are also working to finalize the project's transmission line route.

As of August 2^{Ist}, Chester Municipal Council was awaiting a decision from the Utility and Review Board (UARB) on the appeal of Development Agreement approval. As part of the process, the UARB visited the project area on August 13th.

We are also awaiting the outcome of an appeal regarding NSPI's 49% participation in the project. A hearing will be held on November 27th. This appeal process could continue into early 2014. We remain confident and committed to building the wind farm. Respectful of the process we plan to begin clearing and road construction following resolution of the appeals.



Off to Holland College for George Robson!

On September 5th, the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (UARB) delivered a decision on the appeals of Chester Municipal Council's Development Agreement approval. The UARB decided to uphold Council's approval of the Development Agreement. The appeals were filed by the Friends of South Canoe Lake and by Richburg LP Management Inc. and Homburg Land Bank Corporation Limited.

We are pleased to hear of the outcome of the UARB process and appreciate the time and effort that was put into the process by all parties over the past months. The decision confirms that Council's decision carried out the intent of the Municipal Planning Strategy. You can read more on the UARB's decision on our website.

We look forward to continuing to work closely with you and our Community Liaison Committee on making South Canoe a successful project.

Starting in January, South Canoe will have a New Ross office at Cottage at the Cross (50 Forties Rd.) right next to the Credit Union. We plan to hold office hours at this location and will share more info in an upcoming newsletter and New Ross Flyer.



Last spring, we invited local businesses to share their information with the project team. Thank you to everyone who has contributed thus far. Recent grad and New Ross resident Rhea Hamlin is currently completing the directory and will be contacting those listed to ensure that all information is complete. Once finalized, the directory will be shared with major project contractors. Stay tuned for more updates on the directory. We have finalized civil design work and will be issuing Requests for Proposals for clearing, roads and foundations work in December. We plan to begin land clearing through the winter and road construction in May 2014. Design work on the Operations and Maintenance building, substation and collection system are ongoing.

The project has finalized a transmission line route that will take power from the site and connect into the electrical grid. The line will go eastward off the site and then north to interconnect with the existing grid. Environmental studies have been conducted to ensure minimal impact and landowner agreements have been signed.

With regard to project approvals, the November 27th hearing date on the appeal of Nova Scotia Power's 49% role in the project has been delayed. A new date for the Hearing has not been set by the Court of Appeals.
