#### New Ross Office

As of January 2014, South Canoe is renting the "Cottage at the Cross" in New Ross (50 Forties Rd.). Project team members will hold office hours and will post these once a regular routine is established. The public is welcome to visit the office. Meetings and events will be held there over the duration of project construction.

#### **Development Agreement**

Development Agreement was approved by Council on November 14, 2013.

- Transportation Infrastructure and Renewal (TIR) has been provided a report of the proposed transportation route as well as "dummy permits". TIR is currently evaluating the route – Hwy 103, exit 9, Hwy 12, Lake Lawson Rd, New Russell Rd to main entrance of the site.
- Will award contracts for roads, foundations, and turbine erection by the end of February
- Will order equipment for substation and transmission line
- Will complete the electrical and foundation design packages
- Wind turbines will be manufactured
- Road construction will begin May 2014

#### Questions on project construction:

- What is the size of the O&M building? 4,000-5,000 square feet, will contain warehouse, offices, shower, and will store supplies and tools.
- Where will the O&M building be located? In the middle of the site, see the yellow square on the map. The substation will be located next to the O&M building.
- Does Acciona's RFP for roads and foundations include local content? *Project team has* enhanced language on local content in Acciona's RFP. The goal is to bring local contractors into larger contracts, ie. local subcontracting is possible.
- Is the CBEx appeal process affecting the schedule? We are proceeding with work on-site while the appeal is open. The November 27, 2013 hearing did not take place and the Court of Appeals has not rendered a decision on the confidentiality of NSPI's documents. Court of Appeals asked UARB to review documents again and UARB replied last week saying that the documents should remain confidential. A final decision is pending.

	Business Directory
	One of the project's priorities is to use as many local resources as possible. The project has been working on a local business directory for the project since Spring 2013 with aim to compile a comprehensive list of local skills and services and share this with project contractors. In November, the project hired New Ross recent university grad Rhea Hamlin to help complete the business directory.
	Rhea called businesses to complete their information and confirm their permission to share info with project contractors and the "Why Here" initiative. "Why Here" was developed by the six municipalities in Lunenburg and Queens counties to raise the profile of local businesses and includes a detailed website with an online interactive map showing business locations and descriptions.
	The outputs of Rhea's work are a database that will be shared with contractors as well as one-pagers on accommodations, food and leisure which will be shared with all workers on the site. "Why Here" has also received the database for local businesses. The project will meet with Jeannette Reeves, NRRDS President, to receive her feedback and understand how the NRRDS would like to use the information.

### Construction Update – Roger Myette, George Robson

- Over 130 workers onsite
- Achieved 80,000 man hours last week
- Zutphen has 20km of road roughed in
- Roads built with on-site rock
- 60% done blasting, blast at turbine 10 to come, need to blast 19 turbine sites
- 15 foundations blasted thus far
- 4 rebar-complete for foundations
- 3 foundation bases were poured recently
- Blasting steps include grub organics down to rock, drill hole, load with dynamite and shoot blast
- Powertel is installing collector system 507 poles required, 32 installed poles, framed half of the poles, will start doing 20 poles/day for collection system, all holes are drilled into rock in 2-14mins.

- Backup power for trailers will be installed soon.
- Substation construction underway
- Transmission line is being installed by Emera Utility Services blasting done, 80 of 100 structures installed, 50 framed, pulling wire now

## Environmental Update – Jenny Pratt

- 7 of 11 culverts installed, must be done by end of September
- Wetland alterations did first round of monitoring a few weeks ago, completed preconstruction and during-construction monitoring. Must monitor for 5 years after wetland is altered. Monitor changes in water table, vegetation, wildlife.
- If altering a wetland, must compensate by creating a new wetland twice the size and must conduct wetland research -> now working on enhancing local wetlands but can also enhance wetlands in other spots in the Province.
- Wildlife cameras have not seen moose but have seen deer, coyotes, bears, and bobcats.

## Community Update – Mary-Frances Lynch

- School Presentation on May 27<sup>th</sup> to grades 5/6 class in New Ross. We talked about wind and tidal energy and students assembled their own 3D printed turbine and made an underwater tidal environment. Showed pictures from class session.
- Thanks to all who came out to the pig roast on June 13, a few hundred in attendance, local food and music. Showed pictures of event.
- Team of volunteers at NR fair on August 16.

### Project Update – Sean Brennan

- Towers will be manufactured in Trenton, NS -> 5 tower sections per turbine.
- Map of transportation route for towers avoids most of 104 and 102 by taking back roads. Tower cannot fit underneath highway 102 overpass. Report analyzes each road, highway, and turns along the route.
- Route from Exit 9 on highway 103 will be the same for all equipment -> go up Hwy 12, take Lake Lawson Rd, to New Russell Rd.
- Route was analyzed from Liverpool to site it was determined that certain bridges need to be upgraded. Morley Bridge will be upgraded permanently at cost to the project.
- Municipality will receive the transportation management plan.
- Deliveries scheduled to begin the week of October 6th. 2-3 turbines delivered per week.
- Weather will dictate schedule, wind speeds will be limiting factor in offloading turbines and crane use. Site has 10 yrs of wind data and so we know that winter months are windiest.
- Schedule for project completion will likely get pushed into early 2015.

- Zutphen has 27km of 30km roads roughed in
- 22 foundations complete as of Friday Sep 19, 12 left to pour, last pour October 15
- 65 pieces of equipment building roads
- Substation complete, commissioning now
- T-Line complete, will be tied in mid-October
- More new workers arriving to site weekly
- Minas' transformer is on-site and tested, second transformer comes in November
- Collection system 250 of 507 poles installed
- Warehouse on Hwy 14 to house minor components
- Acciona Wind Power now onsite
- Erection contractor SureSpan using local cranes and union workers
- RikJak from Lunenburg broke ground on Operations and Maintenance building
- Shipment of blades, nacelles and hubs arrived in Liverpool last week
- 170,000 man hours, 200 people on site, over 200,000 man hours by end of October
- Weather is a big factor for work
- Had to use backup plan on concrete once, used South Shore Ready Mix as backup
- 9-10 hours per foundation pour

### Transportation of Turbines – Sean Brennan

- Have been speaking with residents, businesses, trucking association, school board, media, etc on the turbine deliveries
- Collin Hughes' parking lot across the street to be used as a viewing location
- Monday to Friday for deliveries (ideally Mon-Thurs), schedule for first week
- Safety priority, especially on first week
- Nacelle will travel slower than blades and hubs, base tower slower than other tower sections
- Blades and tower sections will travel just below speed limit
- Larger components travelling 35-50km/h
- Learning curve on first deliveries
- Some trees will be trimmed to accommodate turbine deliveries.
